### **Mobile Food Pantry Report**

Thanks to all those who helped with the pantry on Friday. Representatives from Catholic Charities were here to thank the volunteers with cupcakes and lemonade. We received a plaque of recognition for our first year of participation in the pantry. We served a record number of families this month. Ninety-three families, 236 persons, received food, two families were turned away as we ran out, twenty-five were first time visitors, The families included 64 children under eighteen and 33 seniors. Fifty-five of the families were unemployed. Please remember that we are always looking for help with the pantry. We can really use a few more strong individuals that can help set and take down the tables. The Mobile Pantry is a blessing to all that come to use it and I hope that the communities of St. Mary and St. Augustine will continue to support it.
