## "Feed the Hungry." — Corporal Works of Mercy

Catholic Charities reaches out to the rural parishes in the Diocese of Madison each month through our Parish Mobile Food Pantry Program. Since 2005, it has been our mission to address the basic need of food for families and individuals. The Parish Mobile Food Pantry served over 48,000 with 563 tons of food in 2009.

We reach out to 13 different parishes. Parishes currently being served include: St. Joseph Parish, Fort Atkinson; St. Mary Parish, Palmyra; St. Victor Parish, Monroe; St. John Parish, Patch Grove; St. Vincent de Paul with St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception, Portage; Immaculate Conception Parish, Boscobel; St. Anthony & St. Philip Parish, Highland; Sacred Heart, Reedsburg; St. John Vianney Parish, Janesville; and Holy Rosary Parish, Darlington. St. Mary Parish & St. Augustine University Parish, Platteville.
