A heartfelt "Thank You" to all of the parishioners of St. Mary's and St. Augustine's for their prayers and financial support of the 2011 Mission Team that was in Jamaica 6 through 14 January . I promise you that the lives of many poor Jamaican families were made significantly better because of your support. One very small home housing the (18) members of a four generation family received a new roof, new siding and a bedroom addition. Another tiny home of a very elderly woman received a new roof and siding. Another man and his wife who cared for orphan Jamaican children were given a new roof. Several other homes received new doors, steps and a variety of miscellaneous home improvements. None of these homes had water or sewer and many do not have electricity. In addition we were able to give our sister parish (Our Lady of the Assumption in Porus, Jamaica) \$500.00 that will be used to provide food and clothing as required to extremely needy families. We were also able to donate \$500.00 to a Mother Teresa Sisters of Missionary Charity Elder Care Facility. The facility cares for approximately (70) elderly men and woman most of which are picked up from the streets and brought to this facility for care. And last a \$250.00 donation was given to St. John Bosco Children's Orphanage (Sisters of Mercy). This facility provides a home and school for (200) homeless street orphans. The families included 166 individuals, 40 children, 23 seniors and 49 of the families reported as being unemployed.
