PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING CEMETERY RULES

No trees, shrubs, rock gardens or ground displays are to be planted or established. Artificial and cut flowers are permitted if clamped to the monument or on a one-legged stand directly over the monument, or in a non-breakable container adjacent to the side of the monument. No glass containers are to be used in the cemetery.

Flowers may be planted at the side of monuments.

All floral urns must be placed at the side of monuments.

Calvary Cemetery reserves the right to remove or dispose of any unsightly arrangements or unattended flowers.

Clean up days are the 1st Saturdays of April and October.
