MOBILE PANTRY NEWS

Thanks to everyone who helped with the Mobile Food Pantry last week. We were challenged to stretch the food we received for 80 families to feed the ninety-five that showed up. Everyone went home with something so you all did a great job with the distribution. We distributed to ninety-five families which included 66 children, 122 adults and 38 seniors. 68 of the families reported as being unemployed. The families represented 14 area zip codes. Next month Sue Palmer from Catholic Charities and Mona Winston from Second Harvest will be with us at the food distribution. They will bring a thank you gift of lemonade and cupcakes for all of the volunteers. Please try to be at this Pantry to meet Sue and Mona. As a general rule, if the weather is good we will be outside, otherwise, we will set up in the gym. We are getting so good at this that it only takes about fifteen minutes to set up. This food distribution is so very much appreciated by the food recipients that at least twelve folks help us set up and unload food every month. I also want to mention that the Mobile Pantry received a donation from WGLR Holiday Auction and the Outreach Committee will address the best way to use these funds for our pantry.
