A check for \$18,000 has been given to the Parish as the profit from the September 17-18, 2011 Harvest Fest celebration. The committee members met on Monday, October 17 to do an overall review of the Harvest Fest. Our profit is almost \$3,000 more than last year. The number of dinners was up from 700 to 819. Serving the meal buffet style cut down on the waste and was viewed a good improvement. Participation overall was up from 2010. Adding bingo, the bands and the Saturday night session helped bring up the profits as well. Next year we are looking to having the Festival on the fourth Sunday of September in an effort to avoid conflicting with the Second Harvest Food Pantry. The generosity of all who gave of time, talent and treasure made this parish family annual gathering successful.
