## MOBILE FOOD PANTRY

Thanks to everyone who showed up to help with the Mobile Pantry. The earlier time helped and Second Harvest was able to stay with the truck to keep the frozen food frozen longer. So, the distribution went without a hitch except for having about 20 more families than we were anticipating. We did manage to stretch our food so that everyone got something.

We served 106 families that included 231 individuals, 62 under 18, 129 adults and 42 seniors; 81 of the families reported as being unemployed. We had 26 first time visitors to the pantry.
