Rate Change effective June 1, 2013

### Cost of Grave Space

Traditional 4 ft by 12ft grave space, \$550.

### Burial Options

Option 1: A full or traditional burial (Vault Casket) in one grave space.

Option 2: A full traditional burial plus two cremations in one grave space with one head stone.

Option 3: Four cremations in one grave space with one head stone.

### Burial Cost; Weekday, Weekends or Holidays

Grave Openings: Traditional \$600

Infants Vault \$300

Cremation Opening \$275

Cremation urns to be made of no disposable material.

Additional cost per hour for jack hammering or thawing frozen ground @\$90 per hour.
