Celebrate the Paschal mystery of our Lord during the Holy Triduum. On Holy Thursday we recall the last Passover celebration with Jesus and his disciples. Jesus washes their feet exemplifying for them his choice to serve others out of love even to death. We leave in silence. We meet again on Good Friday recalling Jesus' suffering and death on the cross; leaving the service again in silence. On Saturday we celebrate Easter Vigil, the first Mass of Easter. The salvation history of our Lord comes alive in the glorious sights, sounds and smells that celebrate the culmination of the Holy Triduum; the Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ.
