

Questions to memorize 6th grade

1. Why is God an endlessly perfect Being?

God is an endlessly or infinitely perfect Being, because He has no limits of any kind.

2. Why is God all-knowing?

God is all-knowing because He knows all things in the past, in the present, and in the future, as well as everything that could be.

3. Is God almighty?

Yes, God is almighty because He can do every good thing. Almighty means able to do anything.

4. Why do we believe in the mystery of the Holy Trinity?

We believe in the mystery of the Holy Trinity because God told us about it, and He is completely truthful; and because our salvation depends on it.

5. Who are angels?

The angels are created beings with minds and wills but without bodies.

6. Who are devils?

The devils are fallen angels, enemies of mankind. All of the angels were created good, but God tested them all to see if they would obey Him out of love. The angel Lucifer and a large number of the other angels refused to obey God. Their will became fixed against God forever.

7. Does God create each soul?

Yes, God creates each soul. Husbands and wives cooperate with God to make the body of each new human being, but God creates the soul and infuses it into the body.

8. When does a Christian commit a mortal sin?

A Christian commits a mortal sin when he (1) does something seriously wrong, (2) knows that it is seriously wrong, and (3) freely chooses to do it.

9. How are venial sins forgiven?

Venial sins are forgiven by God when we are truly sorry for them. We do not have to confess our venial sins to a priest, but we should do so often, because every time we make a good confession, God strengthens us with His grace.

10. What is temptation?

Temptation is an invitation to sin.

11. Why did God the Son come into the world?

God the Son came into the world (1) to give us a share in His own life, (2) to save us from sin, and (3) to renew the world.

12. What trials did Jesus undergo before His death?

Before His death on the Cross, Jesus was put on trial and mistreated by (1) the chief priests and leaders of the Jews, (2) Herod, and (3) Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor, who sent Him to die on the cross.

13. How did Jesus Christ show His power as the Son of God?

Jesus showed His power as the Son of God by His resurrection, which means His rising from the dead.

14. Who is the Holy Spirit?

God the Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Holy Trinity. He is God, just as the Father and Son are God.

15. Why is the Catholic Church called the sacrament of Christ?

The Catholic Church, which gives God's grace to the world, is called the sacrament of Christ because it is a visible sign of Christ's presence.
