### “SYMBOLON” ADULT FORMATION AND RCIA

“Symbolon The Catholic Faith Explained,” a formation program that comprehensively covers the Catholic faith.

Presented by Father Faustino after 8am Mass in the Hospitality Room Tuesdays and Wednesdays; June 10 & 11, 17 & 18, & 24 & 25; and July 1 & 2, 8 & 9.

Program topics include: “Symbolon: Knowing the Faith”: The first ten episodes focus on Catholic Beliefs such as the Trinity, redemption in Christ, the Church, the Bible, Mary and the Saints, creation, the fall and the Last Things.

The program includes video presentations with Augustine Institute professors such as Tim Gray, as well as other speakers including Johnette Benkovic, Patrick Coffin, Teresa Tomeo, Jim Beckman, Leah Darrow, Sean Innerst, Curtis Martin and Father Leo Patalinghug. The presentations were filmed in Rome, the Holy Land, Calcutta and at the Denver-based Augustine Institute.

Tim Gray, the Augustine Institute’s president, said that Symbolon is gaining recognition as “one of the most powerful tools the lay faithful can use to educate others in the faith and evangelize.”

### PASTORAL COUNCIL COLUMN

#### Submission and Unity

"Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you" (Hebrews 13:17).

Who are these leaders "who watch over your souls"? They are the hierarchy of the church: our pope, bishops, priests and deacons. They have been appointed by Christ to watch over our spiritual well being. Paul tells us, "let them do this with joy," because to cause them grief is not good for us.

The Catholic Church is not a democracy. It is not governed by representative political forces or by numbers of people who form voting blocs. Christ's appointed ministers, who are charged with proclaiming the truth, govern us in love and patience. If they do less, God will hold them accountable. And if we do not submit to them – as long as they uphold Catholic doctrine - we are refusing to submit to Christ. As difficult as it may sound to our ears, submission is the path to unity:

"Unity is a gift and responsibility: being a sacrament, it configures our mission. It requires a heart stripped of every worldly interest, far from vanity and discord; a welcoming heart, capable of feeling with others and also of considering them more worthy than oneself" (Pope Francis, May 19th).

Therefore, submission is a hallmark of being part of the Body of Christ. Demanding our own view is taking a stand on unholy ground. It is important to stress that we are not meant to become mindless robots without thoughts or feelings. However, the intellect is at the service of the church, not the other way around. Submission is the action of our true selves, the man or woman made in the image of God.

But don't take our word for it: Jesus, what do you say? "I say to you, unless you be converted, and become as little children, you shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 18:3). So let us mature as Christians by becoming as little children, and set our aim on heaven!
