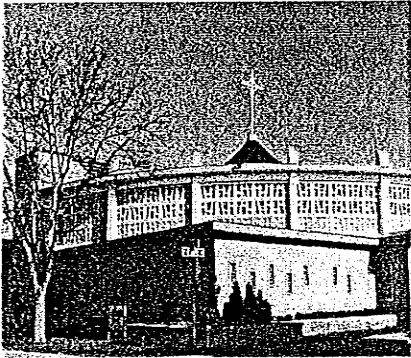

### REFLECTION

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" (John 6:9) The miracle of the Loaves and Fishes is the only miracle which is recorded six times in the Gospel. It carries two important messages. First, no matter how little we have, we always have enough to share. Second, Christ can take our humble gifts and do great things with them if we are just willing to let Him.

**Private Reconciliation**—every day, one hour before each Mass & Thursdays after morning Mass until 9:30am.

**Eucharistic Adoration** on Thursdays begins after 8am Mass and concludes with Rosary and Benediction at 8pm. Adoration will now be in the Chapel.

**The Rosary** is prayed ½ hour before Mass — 3:30 at the Saturday 4pm Mass—8:30 at the Sunday 9am Mass.

### OUR SAINTS FOR THE WEEK

**St. Martha** — Feast Day July 29. She was the sister of Lazarus. She died A.D. 84. She is the Patron Saint of Cooks.

**St. Peter Chrysologus** — Feast Day July 30. He was born in Imola Italy in 406. He is chiefly famed for his assiduity and eloquence in preaching, whence the name give him of Chrysologus, "Golden Speech". He died in 450. He was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1729.

**St. Ignatius Loyola** — Feast Day is July 30. He was born in 1491 and died in 1556. He was the founder of the Society of Jesus.

**St. Alphonsus Liguori** — Feast Day August 1—He was born near Naples in 1696. He was the founder of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer. He died in 1787.

### Pastoral Council Column Primacy of Conscience

I have heard, so many times, the phrase "Primacy of Conscience" used to mean that each of us should decide for ourselves what is right and what is wrong. Sometimes the phrase is "Supremacy of Conscience," but they both mean the same thing.

Indeed, we are to use our God-given gifts of reason and thought, along with prayer, to come to conclusions about moral right and wrong. But this should not be confused with the idea that, if somewhere deep inside I feel strongly enough to disobey Church teaching, I should then follow my own conscience.

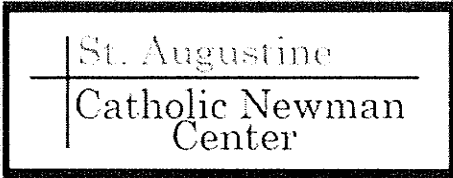
If so many people did not seem to believe that interpretation — one can regularly hear Catholic politicians promoting abortion as if it were a God-given right — it would almost be funny, since the Church telling anyone to follow his own heart would be the same thing as the Church saying that scripture, teaching, and tradition are merely loose guidelines for leading a better life, to accept or reject as we wish. For that, we need no Church!

The fault is in the order in which things are done. In the same way that one cannot build a sturdy house without first creating a solid foundation, we cannot form reliable consciences without standing on the solid base of Church doctrine. A misinformed conscience, no matter how well intentioned, is the result of having first listened to our own hearts rather than having searched the commandments of God passed down to us through the centuries by His Church.

When speaking of Church doctrine, we have to differentiate between the deposit of faith left to us by Jesus Christ, and the possibility of human error made by people within the Church. If a priest, or a bishop — or even a pope — should one day say, "Divorce is a fact of life and the Church should allow it," then we can say that that priest — or bishop or pope — is wrong on that topic. He may be speaking from his heart, but he is not speaking for Church doctrine.

Primacy of Conscience is not a Church doctrine devised as a way to circumvent the doctrine of the Catholic Church. Instead, it is a tool to guard us against the possibility of errors made by individuals within the Church and against the errors of our own hearts, while at the same time honoring our sovereignty as human beings and ensuring the true freedom that we find through a relationship with our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Dear Parishioners,

What is the first thing that comes to your mind at this very moment? I'm sure we each would have a different answer to that question. But actually, how many of us would come up with the right answer? How many of us would have said God or something related to God? That is why, I would like to share with you the story of the conversion of St. Francis Borgia, because like many of us, he too thought about many things until he finally realized that "few things are needed, indeed only one".

It was the year 1539 when Francis was appointed duke of Gandia (Spain), that very same year he was given the mission to lead, to the royal burial grounds of Granada, the remains of Empress Elizabeth. He had seen her many times while still alive, surrounded by flatterers and all the riches of the court. She was considered one of the most beautiful women of her time. It had passed many days since her death to the day they reached Granada, and it was the custom of the time that the one leading the burial procession should uncover the casket to identify the person that was about to be buried. It is said that he was shocked at the sight he saw when he uncovered the casket and that the words he uttered were the following:

"I have brought the body of my lady in strict custody from Toledo to Granada, but to swear it is herself, whose beauty I admired, I dare not. [...] Yes, I swear, she is the one, but also do I swear no more to serve any lord that may die".

At this moment he realized how fleeting were all the things of this world and how he was called to aim higher. So indeed he served no other lord but became a Jesuit priest, devoting himself to the service of God. In that very same way we should stop and think whether we are not worrying too much about worldly things and forgetting to aim higher.

Let us not allow this summer to go by, without truly making an effort in our lives to put God in the center, to give him the place that He deserves in our lives, remembering that anything else should come in second.
